



Social and Academic Probation Agreement for Kindergarten through 8th Grade

In accordance with St. Frances Cabrini Catholic School policies and procedures, every new student will automatically be placed on a social and academic probation status for the first academic trimester the student is enrolled at the school. During this time, St. Frances Cabrini administration and staff reserve the right to determine whether or not the student will be allowed to continue as a member of the St. Frances Cabrini community.

1. The student will exemplify the St. Frances Cabrini character values of **Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, Citizenship** and **Integrity** at all times.
2. The student must follow the rules of the classroom and school.
3. During this time the student will be observed carefully to determine whether or not he/she is positively exhibiting effort to improve his/her attitude and actions.
4. The student must strictly adhere to the St. Frances Cabrini discipline policy/Code of Conduct.
5. The student must not accumulate more than 10 level I infractions or 2 level III infractions during the first trimester.
6. Regular evaluations will be in place during this probation period. If teachers and staff feel that the student is not showing signs of spiritual growth and a desire to excel in the area of self-control and proper attitude, the student will be asked to leave or may withdraw from St. Frances Cabrini Catholic School.
7. Parents and students must read the St. Frances Cabrini Catholic School handbook to be completely aware of all school policies. Failure to do so or not understanding St. Frances Cabrini's standards will not be a viable excuse.
8. Parents must partner with the school and attend meetings as necessary.
9. The student must complete all homework and classwork to the best of their ability by the assignment due date.

At the end of the probation period, the parent/guardians will be notified regarding their child's probation status:

1. If the student is progressing well, the probation status will be lifted.
2. If minor concerns still exist, the administration may ask that the student remain on probation for an additional grading period, to be followed by another evaluation of the student's progress.
3. If substantial progress is not being made and problems continue to exist, the administration in consultation with the parents may decide that St. Frances Cabrini cannot meet the academic/social needs of the student. If this is the case, the student will be withdrawn from the school.
